CECE visits IALR in Danville, VA for staff retreat

The Center for Economic and Community Engagement recently visited the Institute for Advanced Learning and Research (IALR) in Danville, Virginia for a staff retreat. CECE faculty and staff worked on evaluating their strategic planning process and developing strategies for the future with senior economic development specialist Elli Travis and associate director for research development Sarah Lyon-Hill facilitating the discussion, and Ilsa Loeser, founder & principal of Letterpress Communications, offering insight as the session's guest speaker.

CECE faculty and staff went on a tour of IALR, where they were able to see the facility's science and manufacturing labs and meet with president Telly Tucker. From the tour, faculty and staff learned about the Great Opportunities for Technology and Engineering Careers (GO TEC) program, a GO Virginia funded project that introduces K-12 students to STEM careers.

CECE members also saw the Controlled Environment Agriculture Innovation Center, which is housed in a greenhouse complex on the institute's campus and is a joint project between Virginia Tech and IALR. The Innovation Center works to conduct research and educational programming to develop, promote and advance the controlled environment agriculture sector in the U.S. and internationally, bringing together industry, academia, and producers. In 2022 and 2023, CECE collaborated with IALR on a strategy and roadmap for supporting industry growth and workforce development for controlled environmental agriculture in GO Virginia Region 3.

Meet a CECE Advisory Board Member: Blair Durham, Black BRAND



Blair Durham is the president and co-founder of Black BRAND, a non-profit in Hampton Roads that works to increase Black wealth in the region by promoting professional development and community empowerment. In 2021 and 2022 Black BRAND and the Center for Economic and Community Engagement collaborated with Virginia Tech computational modeling and data analytics students to develop a data dashboard that enables Black BRAND to better understand the factors that affect the economic and social progress of Black residents in Hampton Roads. Durham graduated from Virginia Tech in 2005 with a degree in psychology. In April 2023, she received a Virginia Tech Influential Black Alumni Award in the area of social justice.

1. What was your first job and what did it teach you?

I served as a page in the Virginia House of Delegates for three months when I was 13. The job taught me the importance of having confidence and being sure of myself. It also helped me learn how to network and make friends. 25 years later, I'm still in contact with many of the people I first met during that job. The job also allowed me to gain a better understanding of politics and see the workings of government up close, which was a pivotal moment for me.

2. What was your reaction when you learned that you would receive a Virginia Tech Influential Black Alumni award?

I was so happy. The work I do now was fueled by my education from Virginia Tech. The fact that I am able to work in my field and do what I am most passionate about is something I am very grateful for. To then have Virginia Tech recognize my work has been a full circle moment for me.

3. What is your favorite part of your job as president and co-founder of Black BRAND?

It's the incredible people I work with and the business owners we engage with. The relationships I am able to build through my job are what make it fun.
