CECE faculty and staff visit Richmond region for fall staff retreat

In October, Center for Economic and Community Engagement faculty and staff headed to the Richmond region. They visited Virginia State University to meet with Omar Faison, associate vice provost for research and economic development, and VSU deans to discuss future ideas for collaboration.


The team also toured Virginia State University's Randolph Farm, a 416-acre agricultural learning center, home to a multitude of agricultural related research, demonstration and instruction activities.

Staff learned about the town of Hopewell on a Riverwalk led by Heather Lyne, executive director of the Hopewell Downtown Partnership.

The Hopewell Riverwalk, which follows the shoreline of the Appomattox River, will eventually be part of a 25-mile network of trails that connect Hopewell with Dinwiddie County.

The following day, the team worked on strategic planning and had conversations with local economic developers including Ebonie Atkins, managing director of the Henrico Economic Development Authority; David Devan, vice president of economic competitiveness for the Virginia Economic Development Partnership; Matt McLaren, senior project manager at Chesterfield Economic Development; and Leonard Sledge, director of the Department of Economic Development for the City of Richmond.

On the way home, staff based in the Blacksburg and Roanoke area stopped to get ice cream at La Michoacana in Chesterfield.

She is currently serving as the president of the Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations.
